- 1. What are the advantages and disadvantages of partition as a means of resolving ethnic conflict?
- 2. EITHER (a): Evaluate consociationalism as a means of resolving ethnic conflict.
 OR (b): Was the Good Friday Agreement consociational? Do events since 1998 confirm the wisdom of that Agreement?
- 3. Compare multiculturalism as public policy and as ideology. Are there tensions between these two versions?
- 4. 'Samuel Huntington's analysis of ethnicity and nationalism seems to provide a remedy for some of the deficiencies of IR theory pointed out by constructivists.' Discuss.
- 5. Using examples, discuss the ways in which national identity affects foreign policy, and vice versa.
- 6. Giving examples, discuss the ways in which ethnic diasporas affect states' foreign policies.
- 7. Three cardinal principles of international law can conflict: the right to self-determination of peoples; national sovereignty; and individual human rights. Using examples, explain why these conflicts arise. In these cases, which principle won out?
- 8. Which factors facilitate and which factors slow the development of a European identity capable of replacing national identity as the basis of legitimate government?
- 9. Can the rise of political Islamism be explained using theories of nationalism? Which theory, if any, is the most persuasive?
- 10. Will the low birth rate of secular-liberals cause violent ethnic conflict to increase, whether in Western societies or in the international arena?
- 11. What evidence is there that rising ethnic diversity reduces solidarity? Answer with reference to at least one quantitative study.
- 12. What is the liberal-nationalist critique of cosmopolitanism? Is liberal-nationalism compatible with liberty and equality?
